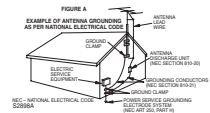

Important Safeguards

- Read Instructions - All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.

Installation Location

For safety and optimum performance of this unit:

- Install the unit in a horizontal and stable position. Do not place anything directly on top of the unit. Do not place the unit directly on top of the TV.

Maintenance

SERVICING

CLEANING THE CABINET

Before you start

Features

This DVD unit not only plays DVD's and CD's but also offers features for you to record to DVD discs and edit them after that.

The following features are offered with this DVD recorder.

Recording

This DVD recorder is compatible with both DVD-RW, which is rewritable repeatedly, and DVD-R, which is available for recording once. You can choose either one for your convenience.

Up to 8 program recording:

You can program the DVD recorder to record up to 8 programs, up to a year in advance. Daily or weekly program recordings are also available.

One-touch timer recording:

You can easily set a recording time as you prefer. Every time the REC button pressed during recording, the recording time will be increased by 30 minutes up to 4 hours. The recording automatically stops when the recording time you set is reached.

REC MONITOR:

You can confirm the picture quality for recording in the current recording speed which you set. If you want to change the recording speed, press REC SPEED button to set the desired recording mode.

Automatic Chapter marker setting:

Chapter markers will be put on recordings as you set in SETUP menu before attempting to record.

Automatic Title menu making:

The DVD recorder makes title menus automatically when finalizing the disc which are recorded in Video mode.

Automatic PLAYLIST making (VR mode):

A Playlist will be prepared from an Original list, so that you can edit titles in a Playlist as you prefer.

An Original list is kept as it is.

Play

Theater surround sound in your home:

When connecting the DVD recorder to an amplifier or a decoder which is compatible with Dolby Digital, you are able to experience the theater surround sound from discs which contain tracks recorded in Dolby Digital format.

Quick search for what you want to watch:

You can easily find the part you want to watch using the search function. Search for a desired point on a disc by title, chapter, or time.

Start to play from Original and Playlist:

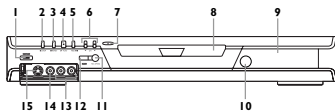
Title playing is available from either an Original list or Playlist.

Front Panel



1. POWER button

Press to turn the DVD recorder on and off. If timer programmings have been set, press to set the unit in timer-standby mode.

2. STOP ■ button

Press to stop play or recording.

3. REV ◀ button

Press to skip to the previous chapter or track. Press and hold for 1.5 seconds to fast reverse.

4. PLAY ▶ button

Press to start or resume play.

5. FWD ▶▶ button

Press to skip to the next chapter or track. Press and hold for 1.5 seconds to fast forward.

6. CH ▼ / ▲ button

Press to change the channel up and down.

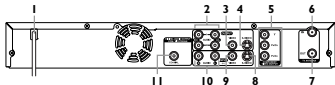
7. ▲ (OPEN/CLOSE) button

Press to open or close the disc tray.

8. Disc tray

Place a disc when open.

Rear Panel



1. AC Power Cord

Connect to a standard AC outlet to supply power to this unit.

2. AUDIO OUTPUT jacks 1, 2

Use to connect a TV monitor, AV receiver or other equipment with standard audio cables.

3. VIDEO OUTPUT jack

Use to connect a TV monitor, AV receiver or other equipment with a standard video cable.

4. S-VIDEO OUTPUT jack

Use to connect the S-Video input of a TV monitor, AV receiver or other equipment with an S-Video cable (not included).

5. COMPONENT VIDEO OUTPUT jacks

Use to connect a TV monitor with component video inputs with component video cables (not included).

6. TV ANTENNA IN jack

Use to connect an antenna.

7. TV ANTENNA OUT jack

Use to connect an antenna cable to pass the signal from the TV ANTENNA IN to your TV monitor.

8. S-VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE1)

Use to connect the S-Video output of external equipment with an S-Video cable (not included).

9. VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE1)

Use to connect external equipment with a standard video cable.

10. AUDIO INPUT jacks(LINE1)

Use to connect external equipment with standard audio cables.

11. COAXIAL DIGITAL AUDIO OUTPUT jack

Use to connect an AV receiver, Dolby Digital decoder or other equipment with a coaxial digital input with a digital coaxial cable (not included).

12. REC button

Press to start recording.

13. AUDIO INPUT jacks(LINE2)

Use to connect external equipment with standard audio cable.

14. VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE2)

Use to connect external equipment with a standard video cable.

15. S-VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE2)

Use to connect the S-Video output of external equipment with an S-Video cable.

16. DISPLAY button

Refer to "Front Panel Display Guide" on page 12.

17. REMOTE CONTROL sensor

Receive signals from your remote control so that you can control the DVD recorder from a distance.

18. REC button

Press to start recording.

19. AUDIO INPUT jacks(LINE2)

Use to connect external equipment with standard audio cable.

20. VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE2)

Use to connect external equipment with a standard video cable.

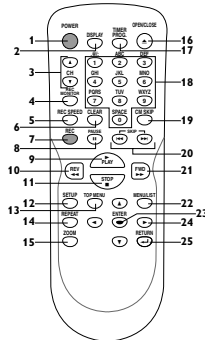
21. S-VIDEO INPUT jack(LINE2)

Use to connect the S-Video output of external equipment with an S-Video cable.

Functional overview (cont'd)

Remote Control



1. POWER button

Press to turn the DVD recorder on and off. If timer programmings have been set, press to set the unit in timer-standby mode.

2. DISPLAY button

Press to display or change the on-screen display.

3. CH ▲ / ▼ buttons

Press to change the channel up and down.

4. REC MONITOR button

Press to check the video signal to be recorded before attempting.

5. REC SPEED button

Press to switch the recording speed.

6. CLEAR button

Press to clear the password once entered or to cancel the programming for CD or to clear the selecting marker number in the marker setup mode or to clear the program once entered in the timer recording setting mode, etc.

7. REC button

Press once to start a recording. Press repeatedly to start a One-Touch Recording.

8. PAUSE II button

Press to pause play or recording.

9. PLAY ▶ button

Press to start or resume play.

10. REV ◀ button

During playback, press to play in fast reverse.

Or when playback is paused, press to play slow reverse.

11. STOP ■ button

Press to stop play or recording.

12. SETUP button

Press to display the setup menu. During DVD playback, press and hold for more than 3 seconds to switch to the progressive scanning mode or the interface mode.

13. TOP MENU button

Press to display the top menu.

14. REPEAT button

Press to display the repeat setting menu.

15. ZOOM button

During playback, press to enlarge the picture on the screen.

16. OPEN/CLOSE ▲ button

Press to open or close the disc tray.

17. TIMER PROG. button

Press to display the timer program setting menu.

18. Number buttons

Press to select channel numbers. Press to select a title/chapter/track on display or a TV channel.

Or press to enter values for the settings in the SETUP menu.

19. CM SKIP button

During playback, press to skip 30 seconds.

20. SKIP ◀ button

During playback, press to skip to the previous chapter or track. Or when playback is paused, press to play forward step by step.

SKIP ▶▶ button

During playback, press to skip to the next chapter or track. Or when playback is paused, press to play forward step by step.

21. FWD ▶▶ button

During playback, press to play fast forward. Or when playback is paused, press to play fast forward.

22. MENU/LIST button

Press to display the Disc menu. To change ORIGINAL and PLAYLIST on the TV screen. (VR mode only)

23. ENTER button

Press to confirm or select menu items.

24. ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ buttons

Press to select items or settings.

25. RETURN ◀ button

Press to return to the previously displayed menu screen.

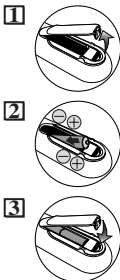

Installing batteries in the remote control

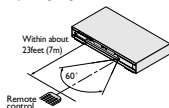
Install two AA batteries (supplied) matching the polarity indicated inside battery compartment of the remote control.



Using a remote control

Keep in mind the following when using the remote control:

- Make sure that there is no obstacle between the remote control and the remote sensor on the DVD recorder.
- Use within the operating range and angle as shown.
- Remote operation may become unreliable if strong sunlight or fluorescent light is shining on the remote sensor of the DVD recorder.
- Remote control for different devices can interfere with each other. Avoid using remote control for other equipment located close to the DVD recorder.
- Replace the batteries when you notice a fall off in the operating range of the remote control.



Note:

Incorrect use of batteries can result in hazards such as leakage and bursting. Please observe the following:

- Do not mix new and old batteries together.
- Do not use different kinds of batteries together, although they may look similar; different batteries may have different voltages.
- Make sure that the plus and minus ends of each battery match the indications in the battery compartment.
- Remove batteries from equipment that is not going to be used for a month or more.
- When disposing of used batteries, please comply with governmental regulations or environmental public instruction's rules that apply in your country or area.
- Do not recharge, short-circuit, heat, burn or disassemble batteries.

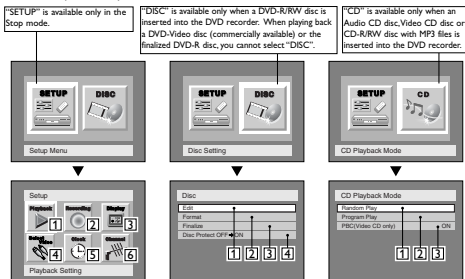
Guide to On Screen Menus

The DVD recorder uses the following on screen menu for most operations. SETUP/DISC/CD menu, Title list, and DISPLAY menu, which allows you to change the playing status of disc during play. The DISPLAY menu also gives you some disc information for checking the status of the disc.

SETUP/DISC/CD menu

Press SETUP button to display the setup main menu, then choose either of SETUP/DISC/CD by ▲/▼/◀/▶ button. Then, press ENTER button to display each menu.

These menus provide entry to all main functions of the DVD recorder.



1. Playback:

To set up the DVD recorder to play discs as you prefer.

2. Recording:

To set up the DVD recorder to record to discs as you prefer.

3. Display:

To set up the OSD screen and the front display of the DVD recorder as you prefer.

4. Select Video:

To choose a line input to record to DVD discs from other video equipment.

5. Clock:

To set up the clock of the DVD recorder as you need.

6. Channel:

To adjust the channel setting of the DVD recorder as you prefer.

1. Edit:

Turns on a title list, (When a disc with VR mode is inserted, "Original" or "PlayList" is available.), which shows the recorded titles on the disc.

2. Format:

Allows you to erase all of the recorded content on the disc. The disc will be completely blank.

3. Finalize:

Allows you to finalize a disc containing recorded titles.

4. Disc Protect

(VR mode only): Allows you to protect a disc from accidental editing or recording.

Note:

Make sure batteries are in the remote control and you have connected this unit and the TV correctly.

Step 1: Choose a disc type

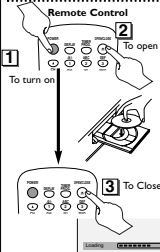
There are several types of recordable DVD discs to choose from. Choose a recordable DVD disc type based on your playing/recording/editing requirements. See "DVD disc types" at the bottom of this page for more information on the differences between the different kinds of compatible media. This DVD recorder can record on the following type of discs.



For example, when you want to record repeatedly on the same disc, or when you want to edit the disc after recording, select the rewritable DVD-RW type disc.

When you want to save recordings without any alteration, a non-rewritable DVD-R can be your choice.

Step 2: Insert a blank disc



This operation may take a while to be recognized.

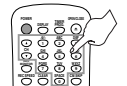

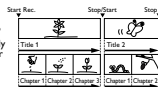


Hint 1: Play the recorded contents

You can select the title you want to play from a displayed menu, and immediately start to play. Recorded contents are very accessible on a disc, the procedure is really simple as you choose a title on a chapter from the menu screen.

What are titles and chapters?

The contents of DVD disc are generally divided into titles. Titles may be further subdivided into chapters.



Hint 2: Edit the recorded disc

You will find editing discs is very easy, and the DVD recorder offers convenient edit functions, which are possible only with DVD-R/RW discs.

You can edit the following from a title list.

- Putting names on titles
- Setting pictures for thumbnails (VR mode)
- Setting/clearing chapter markers
- Deleting parts of titles (VR mode)

Original and Playlist (VR mode)

You can edit the recordings in Playlist without changing the original recordings. A Playlist does not take up much disc space.

What "Original" or "Playlist" is for?

Throughout this manual, you will find *Original* and *Playlist* to refer to the actual content and the edited version.

- **Original** content refers to what's actually recorded on the disc.
- **Playlist** content refers to the edited version of the disc; how the Original content is to be played.

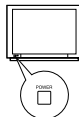

Getting channels automatically

The disc format for DVD-R is always "Video format," so a recording format will be "Video mode." On the other hand, when recording to DVD-RW, a recording format will be "Video mode" or "VR mode" because a disc format is available between "Video Recording format" and "Video format" for DVD-RW.

About Video mode and VR (Video Recording) mode

Video mode is the same recording format as DVD-Video discs produced locally, so that you can play in most DVD players. To play in other DVD players, you will need to finalize (see page 39). Unless finalized, you can play, record additionally or edit discs recorded in Video mode with this unit. VR (Video Recording) mode is a basic recording format for DVD-RW. You can record and edit repeatedly.

DVD players with **RW** are capable of playing DVD-RW recorded in VR mode.

Restrictions on recording

You cannot record copy-protected video using this DVD recorder. Copy-protected video includes DVD-Video discs and some satellite broadcasts. If copy-protected material is encountered during a recording, recording will pause or stop automatically and an error message will be displayed on screen. Video that is "copy-once only" can only be recorded using a DVD-RW disc in VR mode with CPRM (see below).

When recording a TV broadcast or through an external input, you can display copy control information on screen.

What is "CPRM"?

CPRM is a copy protection system with scramble system regarding the recording of "copy once" broadcast programs. CPRM stands for Content Protection for Recordable Media. This DVD recorder is CPRM compatible, which means that you can record copy-once broadcast programs, but you cannot then make a copy of those recordings. CPRM recordings can only be made on DVD-RW discs formatted in VR mode, and CPRM recordings can only be played on players that are specifically compatible with CPRM.

Making discs playable in other DVD player (Finalize)

You will need to finalize discs in the following cases:
- when playing DVD-R/RW (Video mode) recorded with this DVD recorder in other DVD players.

- when DVD-RW (VR mode) recorded with this DVD recorder fails to be played in other DVD players.

• Once DVD-R/RW (Video mode) is finalized, you cannot record additionally or edit.

• You can record additionally to or edit DVD-RW (VR mode), which is finalized with this DVD recorder.

• Be sure to finalize discs recorded with this DVD recorder by using this DVD recorder.

• Title menu will be created automatically in DVD-R/RW (Video mode) finalized with this DVD recorder.

- The audio and video quality is getting poorer as the Recording time becomes longer.
- This recorder cannot record CD-R or CD-RW discs.
- DVD-R/RW and CD-R/RW discs recorded using a personal computer or a DVD or CD recorder may not play if the disc is damaged or dirty, or if there is dirt or condensation on the player's lens.
- If you record a disc using a personal computer, even if it is recorded in a compatible format, there are cases in which it may not play because of the settings of the application software used to create the disc. (Check with the software publisher for more detailed information.)

Guide to displays

Press DISPLAY button to call up the display menu. This menu will give you the information on the playing disc. Some operations are available while disc is playing.



1. Indicates a disc type and a format mode.
2. Indicates a recording speed and possible recording time. / Indicates a channel number.
3. Indicates a title number, chapter number, and the time lapse of disc play.

This DVD Recorder uses NTSC, so DVDs you play must be recorded in the NTSC system. You cannot play DVDs recorded in other color system.

Region codes

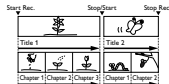
This DVD recorder has been designed to play DVD discs with Region One (1). DVDs must be labeled for ALL regions or for Region 1 in order to play on the DVD recorder. You cannot play DVDs that are labeled for other regions. Look for the symbols below on your DVD. If these region symbols do not appear on your DVD, you cannot play the DVD in this DVD recorder.



The number inside the globe refers to region of the world. Region 1 represents the United States, Canada, Bermuda, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and small regions near Australia. A DVD labeled for a specific region can only play on the DVD recorder with the same region code.

The contents of DVD disc are generally divided into some titles. Titles may be further subdivided into chapters.

This unit conforms to ver.1.1 and ver.2.0 of Video CD

standard, with PBC function.

Ver.2.0 (with PBC function): While using a Video CD with PBC function, "PBC" appears on the screen and the display.

What is PBC? "PBC" stands for the Playback Control. You can play interactive software using menu screens. Refer to instructions in the Video CD.

When playing Video CDs with PBC function, only "PBC" is displayed instead of the playing time and current track indications on the front panel display. Also, some operations cannot be performed unless the function is cancelled intentionally by you or automatically.

Guide to a title list

Title list allows you to check the titles recorded on the disc easily. You can choose a title to play from this screen and easily edit the titles as you prefer.



1. Titles recorded on the disc can be selected to edit by pressing ENTER button with the cursor on the title.
2. Protect icon, which appears when the title has been protected.
3. The selected title thumbnails from the title list.
4. The menus in here for editing titles as you prefer. The available menus depends on the disc type and the format type.
5. The details of the title, which can be changed to the title name you will edit.
6. Time status bar of the title.
7. The arrow icon, which means the title list includes a next or a previous page. Press ► or ◀ button by following direction of the icon.

Others

Glossary

Analog audio

An electrical signal that directly represents sound. Compare this to digital audio which can be an electrical signal, but is an indirect representation of sound. See also Digital audio.

Aspect ratio

The width of a TV screen relative to its height. Conventional TVs are 4:3 (in other words, the screen is almost square); widescreen models are 16:9 (the screen is almost twice as wide as it is high).

Chapter

Just as a book is split up into several chapters, a title on a DVD disc is usually divided into chapters. See also Title.

Component video output

Each signal of luminance(Y) and component(Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr) is independent to output so that you can experience picture color as it is. Also, due to compatibility with progressive scan video (525p/480p), you can experience higher-density picture than that in interlace (525i/480i).

CPRM

(Content Protection for Recordable Media)

CPRM is a copy protection system with scramble system regarding the recording of "copy-once" broadcast programs (e.g. some satellite broadcasts).

Digital audio

An indirect representation of sound by numbers. During recording, the sound is measured at discrete intervals (44,100 times a second for CD audio) by an analog-to-digital converter, generating a stream of numbers. On playback, a digital-to-analog converter generates an analog signal based on these numbers. See also Sampling frequency and Analog audio.

Dolby Digital

The system to compress digital sound developed by Dolby Laboratories. It offers you sound of stereo(2ch) or multi-channel audio (up to 5.1ch).

MP3 (MPEG Audio Layer 3)

MP3 is a method of compressing files. You can copy MP3 files on CD-R/RW discs from the computer, and play the files on this unit.

Finalize

To make DVD discs, which have been recorded on, possible to play in DVD players. With this DVD recorder, it is possible to finalize DVD-R/DVD-RW discs.

PBC (VCD only) (Playback Control)

This function allows you to play interactive software using menu screen. See also Title in the Glossary.

PCM

(Pulse Code Modulation)

The most common system of encoding digital audio, found on CDs and DAT. Excellent quality, but requires a lot of data compared to formats such as Dolby Digital and MPEG audio. For compatibility with digital audio recorders (CD, MD and DAT) and AV amplifiers with digital inputs, this unit can convert Dolby Digital and MPEG audio to PCM. See also Digital audio.

Playlist

From this list you can play contents of a disc as your desired order or in sequence. Also it is allowed to search a specific scene directly.

Regions code

Regions associate discs and players with particular areas of the world. This unit will only play discs that have compatible region codes. You can find the region code of your unit by looking on the rear panel. Some discs are compatible with more than one region (or all regions).

Sampling frequency

The rate which sound is measured by a specified interval to turn into digital audio data. The numbers of sampling in one second defines as sampling frequency. The higher the rate, the better the sound quality as possible as it is.

SAP

(Secondary Audio Program)

Sub-audio channel which is delivered separately from main-audio channel. This audio channel is used as an alternate in bilingual broadcasting.

S-Video output

It delivers independently each signal of color(C) and luminance(Y) to TV as video signals, so that higher-quality picture will be gained.

Title

(DVD)

A collection of chapters on DVD disc. See also chapter.

(VCD)

Each contents of a Video CD. When playing a Video CD with PBC function, the title menu will appear automatically.

Track

Audio CDs and Video CDs use tracks to divide up the content of a disc. The DVD equivalent is called a chapter. See also Chapter.
